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**MBI LËVIZJEN E KAFSHËVE TË EGRA BRENDË DHE JASHTË TERRITORIT

Në mbështetje të nenit 102, pika 4, të Kushtetutës, të nenit 64/1, të ligjit nr. 10465, datë 29.9.2019, “Për shërbimin veterinar në Republikën e Shqipërisë”, të ndryshuar,

URDHËROJ:

1. Miratimin e rregullores “Mbi lëvizjen e kafshëve të egra brenda dhe jashtë territorit të Republikës së Shqipërisë”, sipas tekstit bashkëlidhur.

2. Ngarkohen Drejtoria e Përgjithshme Rregullatore dhe e Përputhshmërisë në Bujqësi dhe Zhvillim Rural dhe agjencitë rajonale të shërbimit veterinar dhe të mbrojtjes së bimëve për zbatimin e këtij urdhri.

Ky urdhër hyn në fuqi pas botimit në Fletoren Zyrtare.

RREGULLORE

**MBI LËVIZJEN E KAFSHËVE TË EGRA BRENDË DHE JASHTË TERRITORIT TË
REPUBLIKËS SË SHQIPËRISË**

Neni 1
Qëllimi

Qëllimi i kësaj rregulloreje është përcaktimi i rregullave të lëvizjes së kafshëve të egra brenda dhe jashtë territorit të Republikës së Shqipërisë.

Neni 2
Përkufizime

Për qëllimet e kësaj rregulloreje do të përdoren përkufizimet e mëposhtme:

a) “Kafshë të egra” janë kafshët të cilat kanë një fenotip të pandikuar nga përzgjedhja njerëzore dhe që jetojnë të pavarur nga mbikëqyrja ose kontrolli i drejtpërdrejtë i njeriut.

b) “Kafshë të egra të kafazeve” janë kafshët e egra që kanë një fenotip që nuk është ndikuar nga përzgjedhja e njeriut, por që jetojnë nën mbikëqyrjen ose kontrollin e drejtpërdrejtë të njerëzve, përfshirë kafshët në kopshtet zoologjike.

c) “Jeta e egër” nënkupton kafshët e egra dhe kafshët e egra të pyjeve apo kopshteve zoologjike.

ç) “Vendi i origjinës” është vendi nga i cili origjinojnë kafshët e egra i cili është kapur në gjendje të egër, rritur në gjendje të egër ose shumëzuar artificialisht.

d) “Njoftimi i importit” është njoftimi që jepet nga importuesi ose nga përfaqësuesi i tij 24 orë përpara mbërritjes së ngarkesave të kafshëve të egra të listuara në anekset A, B dhe C.

dh) Hyrje nga deti është hyrja e specieve të llojeve të kafshëve të egra me mjete transporti detare nga deti.

e) “Lëshim i certifikatës” është përmbyllja e të gjitha procedurave që përfshijnë përgatitjen, validimin dhe dërgimin e certifikatës te dërguesi i kafshëve të egra, që do dërgojë ngarkesat në vendin e destinacionit.

ë) “Certifikatë specifike e specieve” janë certifikatat individuale specifike të specieve të caktuara të përmendura në anekset A, B dhe C.

f) “Vendi i destinacionit” është vendi i destinacionit i përcaktuar në certifikatën që përdoret për lëvizjen, importin, eksportin ose riekportin e specieve të llojeve të kafshëve të egra.

g) “Qëllime primare tregtare” janë qëllimet e aspekteve jotregtare, të cilat nuk mbizotërojnë qartë.

gj) “Riekport” është eksporti i specieve të llojeve të kafshëve të egra të cilat kanë hyrë edhe më parë në vendin e destinacionit.

h) “Rihyrje” është hyrja brenda territorit të vendit të destinacionit të çdo specie të llojit të egër që është importuar apo riimportuar edhe më parë

i) “Specie” janë speciet, nënspeciet ose popullatat ku bëjnë pjesë këto specie të listuara në anekset A, B dhe C.

j) “Tregti” nënkupton hyrjen e llojeve të specieve të kafshëve të egra brenda territorit të Republikës së Shqipërisë, duke përfshirë transportin nga deti të tyre, importin dhe riimportin, si dhe përdorimin, lëvizjen dhe transferimin e tyre nga vende të ndryshme të kafshëve të egra të listuara në anekset A, B dhe C.

k) “Tranzit” nënkupton transportin e kafshët e egra të përmendura në anekset A, B dhe C, nëpërmjet 2 vendeve, përmes një territori të një vendi tjetër.

l) “Kontroll në kohën e hyrjes, importit, riimportit dhe tranzitit” nënkupton kontrollin e dokumentacionit, të certifikatave, lejeve dhe njoftimit paraprak të subjektit importues të kafshët e egra, si dhe marrjen e mostrave apo të kampioneve të nevojshme për të analizuar më me detaje këto specie.

Neni 3

Transporti, mbajtja dhe lëvizja e kafshëve të egra

Transporti, mbajtja dhe lëvizja e kafshëve të egra në anekset A, B dhe C kryhet në atë mënyrë që siguron minimizimin e rrezikut të dëmtimit, dëmtimit të shëndetit ose trajtimit mizor të këtyre specieve. Kjo kërkesë zbatohet përmes urdhrit nr. 354, datë 21.12.2011, “Për mbrojtjen e kafshëve gjatë transportit”, e cila thotë se kafshët duhet të transportohen në atë mënyrë që përputhen me kushtet e mirëqenies së kafshëve.

Lëvizja e kafshëve të egra duhet të shoqërohet me certifikatën e lëvizjes së kafshës së egër dhe një autorizim të veçantë të dhënë nga autoriteti kompetent që lejon lëvizjen e kafshës/ve të egra.

Autorizimi për lëvizjen e kafshëve të egra jepet, kur:

a) garanton se vendi i destinacionit të këtyre kafshëve është i siguruar që nuk përbën rrezik për shëndetin apo sulmin e këtyre llojeve të njerëzit;

b) është dhënë certifikata e lëvizjes së kafshës së egër;

c) në certifikatë është përcaktuar saktësisht vendi i destinacionit të këtyre kafshëve.

Ky autorizim nuk është i nevojshëm të merret në qoftë se kafshët e egra do të lëvizin për qëllime të trajtimit urgjent veterinar shëndetësor të tyre dhe kthehen përsëri në vendin e mëparshëm.

Kur një specie e kafshëve të egra transportohet brenda vendit ose mbahet gjatë në periudhë tranzitimi ose transferimi, ato duhet të zhvendosen, duke u kujdesur në atë mënyrë që të minimizohet rreziku i dëmtimeve, dëmtimeve të shëndetit dhe të sigurohet trajtimi i tyre për mbrojtjen e kafshëve të egra gjatë transportit.

Gjatë lëvizjes së tyre duhet të respektohet urdhri nr. 354, datë 21.12.2011, “Për mbrojtjen e kafshëve gjatë transportit”.

Neni 5

Kushtet e përgjithshme të lëvizjes së kafshëve të egra

Kjo rregullore ndalon që një person të transportojë një kafshë të egër ose të bëjë që një kafshë e egër të transportohet në atë mënyrë që të shkaktojë dëmtim ose vuajtje të padrejtë.

Për transportin apo lëvizjen e kafshëve të egra duhet të plotësohen edhe kushtet e mëposhtme:

a) kafshët e egra duhet të jenë në gjendje shëndetësore të përshtatshme për udhëtim dhe nuk përbëjnë rrezik për përhapjen e sëmundjeve të tyre në kafshët e tjera të egra në vendin e destinacionit;

b) kafshët e egra nuk vijnë nga një habitat që u është nënshtruar kufizimeve të lëvizjes së tyre, për shkak se rrezikohet përhapja e sëmundjeve të llojet e tjera të egra;

c) kafshët e egra shoqërohen nga certifikata shëndetësore veterinare në përputhje me kërkesat shëndetësore të kafshëve të egra;

ç) vendi i origjinës ka rënë dakord për kryerjen e kësaj lëvizjeje;

d) është njoftuar vendi i destinacionit 24 orë përpara për mbërritjen e ngarkesës;

dh) automjeti i përdorur për transportimin e kafshëve të egra është projektuar, ndërtuar, mirëmbajtur në atë mënyrë që të shmangët dëmtimi dhe vuajtja e kafshëve të egra që transportohen;

e) objektet e ngarkimit dhe shkarkimit janë disenjuar, ndërtuar, mirëmbajtur në mënyrë të duhur që të shmangen dëmtimet dhe vuajtjet e kafshëve të egra;

ë) personeli që merret me kafshët duhet të jetë i trajnuar për këtë qëllim dhe të kryejë detyrat e tyre pa përdorur dhunë ose ndonjë metodë që ka të ngjarë të shkaktojë frikë, dëmtim ose vuajtje të panevojshme, llojeve të egra;

f) transporti kryhet pa vonesë në vendin e destinacionit dhe kushtet e mirëqenies së kafshëve të egra kontrollohen rregullisht dhe mirëmbahen si duhet;

g) zona e dyshemesë dhe lartësia e mjetit transportues të jetë e atillë për kafshët e egra që të sigurojë mbulimin total sipas madhësinë trupore të tyre gjatë udhëtimit;

gj) uji dhe ushqimi duhet t'u ofrohet kafshëve në interval të përshtatshëm, në cilësi, sasi sipas specieve dhe madhësisë së tyre.

Neni 6

Importi i kafshëve të egra në territorin e Republikës së Shqipërisë

1. Hyrja e specieve të listuara në anekset A, B dhe C, brenda territorit të Republikës së Shqipërisë, duhet t'u nënshtrohet kontroleve të nevojshme paraprake në pikën e inspektimit kufitar. Subjekti importues duhet të jetë i pajisur me një leje importi të lëshuar nga autoriteti kompetent i vendit.

Leja e importit lëshohet vetëm kur janë përmbushur kushtet e mëposhtme:

a) hyrja e kafshëve të egra nuk përbën rrezik për ruajtjen e statusit të specieve apo kafshëve të egra apo të shpërndarjes së këtyre llojeve, specieve në territorin e Republikës së Shqipërisë;

b) kur kafshët e egra hyjnë në territorin e Republikës së Shqipërisë në bazë të nenit 6;

c) kur kafshët e egra hyjnë në territorin e Republikës së Shqipërisë për qëllime të tjera që nuk janë të dëmshme për mbijetesën e specieve në fjalë;

ç) subjekti importues paraqet prova dokumentare që vërteton se speciet, kafshët e egra janë marrë në përputhje me legjislacionin për mbrojtjen e specieve në fjalë, të cilat, në rastin e importit nga një vend i tretë i specieve të listuar në anekset A, B dhe C, subjekti importues duhet të jetë i pajisur me leje eksporti ose një certifikatë eksporti apo riekspori, e lëshuar nga autoriteti kompetent i vendit eksportues;

d) lëshimi i lejeve të importit për speciet e listuara në shtojcën A, duhet të jetë original në çdo import të tillë;

dh) autoriteti kompetent i vendit të destinacionit duhet të jetë i bindur se vendi i akomodimit të llojeve apo kafshëve të egra është i pajisur në mënyrë të atillë që personat janë të ruajtur ndaj dëmtimit që mund të vijë nga këto lloje speciesh;

e) speciet apo kafshët e egra mund të përdoren edhe për qëllime jotregtare;

ë) në rastin e hyrjes nga deti, autoriteti kompetent duhet të jetë i bindur se çdo kafshë e egër e gjallë do të dërgohet në vendin e mbërritjes, duke minimizuar sa më shumë rrezikun e dëmtimit, dëmtimit të shëndetit ose trajtimit mizor të tyre;

2. Autoriteti Kompetent i vendit të destinacionit mund të vendosë kufizime në rastin, kur:

a) kafshët e egra të listuara në anekset A, B dhe C, të cilat kanë një shkallë të lartë vdekshmërie gjatë dërgesës ose është vërtetuar se ata nuk kanë gjasa të mbijetojnë në robëri për një pjesë të konsiderueshme të jetëgjatësisë së tyre të mundshme;

b) është vërtetuar se hyrja e specieve apo e kafshëve të egra në mjedisin natyror të Republikës së Shqipërisë paraqet një kërcënim ekologjik për speciet e egra të faunës.

Neni 7

Lejet e eksportit për kafshët e egra

Struktura përgjegjëse për veterinarinë dhe autoriteti kompetent duhet të monitorojnë lëshimin e lejeve të eksportit për speciet e listuara në anekset A, B dhe C dhe eksportet aktuale të specieve të tilla. Në rastet kur struktura përgjegjëse për veterinarinë dhe autoriteti kompetent përcakton se eksporti i specieve të tilla duhet të jetë i kufizuar në mënyrë që kjo specie të ruhet në të gjithë gamën e saj në përputhje me rolin e tij/saj në ekosistemin në të cilën ndodhet, atëherë ndërmerren masa për të kufizuar lëshimin e lejeve të eksportit për këto lloj specie.

Në rastet e përmendura më sipër, struktura përgjegjëse për veterinarinë informon vendet e tjera për kufizimet e eksporteve të specieve në fjalë.

Neni 8

Kontrolli i tregtisë

Ndalohet blerja, oferta për blerje, blerja për qëllime tregtare, shfaqja në publik për qëllime tregtare, përdorimi për përfitime dhe shitje, mbajtja në shitje, oferta për shitje ose transportimi për shitje i kafshëve të egra të listuara në anekset A, B dhe C.

Struktura përgjegjëse për veterinarinë mund të ndalojë mbajtjen e specieve të listuara të kafshëve të egra në anekset A, B dhe C.

Në përputhje me legjislacionin në fuqi për ruajtjen e faunës dhe florës së egër, mund të bëhet përjashtim nga ndalimet e përmendura më sipër, duke dhënë lëshimin e certifikatës së importit nga autoriteti kompetent, në të cilat speciet e listuara në anekset A, B dhe C ndodhen, vetëm në rastet, kur:

a) këto specie kanë hyrë në territorin e Republikës së Shqipërisë përpara miratimit të kësaj rregulloreje;

b) janë specie me moshë më shumë se 50 vjet;

c) këto specie nuk do të përdoren për qëllime të dëmshme në të cilën rrezikohet mbijetesa e tyre

ç) këto specie do të përdoren për studime apo eksperimente që i shërbejnë avancimit të shkencës ose qëllime biomjekësore, kur është vërtetuar shkencërisht se këto janë speciet e vetme të përshtatshme në të cilën mund të përdoren për këto qëllime;

d) përdoren për qëllime rritjeje dhe shumimi ose qëllime kërkimore-shkencore;

dh) vijnë nga vende që lejohet eksporti i tyre në bazë të legjislacionit të vendit të origjinës.

Neni 9

Certifikata e lëvizjes apo e eksportit/importit të kafshëve të egra

Certifikata për lëvizjen apo për eksportin e kafshëve të llojeve të egra jepet nga veterineri zyrtar kur është i bindur, se:

a) janë plotësuar kushtet e mirëqenies së kafshëve të egra;

b) kafshët janë në gjendje shëndetësore në përputhje me certifikatën shëndetësore veterinare të eksportit të tyre;

c) janë përmbushur nenet 3, 4, 6 dhe 7.

Përmbajtja e certifikatës:

a) certifikata duhet të jetë në përputhje me certifikatën përkatëse shëndetësore veterinare apo të lëvizjes, në fuqi, të kafshës, species apo llojit të egër;

b) emërtimin e kafshës, species/llojit të egër së bashku me kodin përkatës të species/llojit të egër në bazë të taksonomisë së tyre dhe anekset A, B dhe C;

c) numrin e kafshëve të egra që transportohen;

ç) specifikimet shëndetësore sipas kërkesave të certifikatës shëndetësore veterinare;

d) kushtet specifike të përdorimit të këtyre kafshëve, ku të cilësohet që nuk do të përdoren për qëllime tregtare ose gjueti brenda territorit të tyre, ose në vendin që do të importojë këto specie;

dh) vulën e veterinerit zyrtar që ka bërë kontrollin e kafshëve, llojeve apo specieve të egra.

Neni 10

Humbja e vlefshmërisë së certifikatave shëndetësore veterinare e kafshëve të egra

1. Certifikata shëndetësore veterinare, leja e importit apo dhe dokumentacioneve të tjera që shoqërojnë ngarkesën të dhëna nga autoriteti kompetent i Republikës së Shqipërisë apo edhe i vendeve të tjera e humbasin vlefshmërinë e tyre në rastet kur kafshët, speciet/llojet e egra:

a) kanë ngordhur gjatë transportit;

b) janë larguar ose janë lëshuar nga transportuesi gjatë udhëtimit;

c) kanë humbur, janë shkatërruar ose janë vjedhur;

ç) kur certifikata shëndetësore veterinare nuk vërteton situatën aktuale shëndetësore veterinare të kafshëve, llojeve/specieve të egra.

2. Kur certifikata veterinare, leja e importit apo dhe dokumentacioneve të tjera që shoqërojnë ngarkesën të dhëna nga autoriteti kompetent i Republikës së Shqipërisë apo edhe vendeve të tjera kanë humbur vlefshmërinë e tyre, sipas përcaktimeve të pikës 1, atëherë i kthehen autoritetit kompetent që i ka lëshuar, dhe kur është e arsyeshme kërkohet të bëhen ndryshimet e duhura për që vërteton situatën reale të ngarkesës së kafshëve, llojeve/specieve të egra.

3. Në rastet kur certifikata shëndetësore veterinare që është lëshuar nga autoriteti kompetent ka humbur, është shkatërruar, është vjedhur ose ka skaduar, numri i dokumenteve zëvendësuese dhe arsyet e zëvendësimit të tyre duhet të përcaktohen në certifikatë shëndetësore të re të hapësira “kushte të veçanta”. Në të tilla raste duhet të njoftohet edhe autoriteti kompetent i vendit të origjinës së ngarkesës së kafshëve llojeve/specieve të egra.

Neni 11

Certifikata e panairëve, ekspozitave apo veprimtarive të tjera për kafshët e egra

1. Në rastet kur kafshët e egra të listuara në anekset A, B dhe C lëvizin, importohen, eksportohen, riimportohen apo riekportohen për qëllime të organizimeve të panairëve, ekspozitave apo veprimtarive të tjera, duhet të jenë të pajisur me certifikatën përkatëse të këtyre aktiviteteve.

2. Këto lloj certifikatash lëshohen nga veterineri zyrtar i vendit të origjinës së species/llojit të egër.

3. Kërkesa të veçanta për lëshimin e certifikatave të panairëve, ekspozitave apo veprimtarive të tjera për kafshët e egra;

a) kafshët e egra që marrin pjesë në këto lloj aktiviteteve duhet të jenë të regjistruar në autoritetin kompetent të vendit të origjinës;

b) të tilla kafshë duhet të kthehen përsëri në vendin e tyre të origjinës përpara datës së skadencës së kësaj certifikate;

- c) të tilla kafshë duhet të jenë të markuara apo të shënuara në mënyrë që të vërtetohet identiteti individual i species/llojit që korrespondon në certifikatë;
- ç) kjo certifikatë nuk është e vlefshme nëse nuk është origjinale.

Neni 12

Certifikata individuale e kafshëve të egra

Në rastet kur duhet të kryhet lëvizja, eksporti apo importi i vetëm 1 specieje të listuar në anekset A, B ose C, ato duhet të jenë të shoqëruara nga certifikata shëndetësore veterinarë individuale e tyre.

Kjo certifikatë lëshohet nga veterineri zyrtar vetëm nëse:

- a) specia/lloji i egër është i regjistruar në autoritetin kompetent të vendit të origjinës;
- b) specia/lloji i egër kthehet në vendin e origjinës përpara datës së skadencës së certifikatës;
- c) specia/lloji i egër nuk do të përdoret për qëllime tregtare;
- ç) specia/lloji i egër duhet të jetë i markuar apo shënuar në mënyrë unike për t'u identifikuar nga pronari i tyre.

► **C4** (†) For the exclusive purpose of allowing international trade in fibre from vicuñas (*Vicugna vicugna*) and their derivative products, only if the fibre comes from the shearing of live vicuñas. Trade in products derived from the fibre may only take place in accordance with the following provisions:

- (a) Any person or entity processing vicuña fibre to manufacture cloth and garments must request authorization from the relevant authorities of the country of origin [Countries of origin: The countries where the species occurs, that is, Argentina, Bolivia, Chile, Ecuador and Peru] to use the ‘vicuña country of origin’ wording, mark or logo adopted by the range States of the species that are signatories to the Convention for the Conservation and Management of the Vicuña.

(b) Marketed cloth or garments must be marked or identified in accordance with the following provisions:

- (i) For international trade in cloth made from live-sheared vicuña fibre, whether the cloth was produced within or outside of the range States of the species, the wording, mark or logo must be used so that the country of origin can be identified. The VICUÑA [COUNTRY OF ORIGIN] wording, mark or logo has the format as detailed below:



This wording, mark or logo must appear on the reverse side of the cloth. In addition, the selvages of the cloth must bear the words VICUÑA [COUNTRY OF ORIGIN].

- (ii) For international trade in garments made from live-sheared vicuña fibre, whether the garments were produced within or outside of the range States of the species, the wording, mark or logo indicated in paragraph (b)(i) must be used. This wording, mark or logo must appear on a label in the garment itself. If the garments are produced outside of the country of origin, the name of the country where the garment was produced should also be indicated, in addition to the wording, mark or logo referred to in paragraph (b)(i).

(c) For international trade in handicraft products made from live-sheared vicuña fibre produced within the range States of the species, the VICUÑA [COUNTRY OF ORIGIN] - ARTESANÍA wording, mark or logo must be used as detailed below:



(d) If live-sheared vicuña fibre from various countries of origin is used for the production of cloth and garments, the wording, mark or logo of each of the countries of origin of the fibre must be indicated, as detailed in paragraphs (b)(i) and (ii).

(e) All other specimens shall be deemed to be specimens of species listed in Appendix I and the trade in them shall be regulated accordingly. ◀

- (2) All species are listed in Appendix II to the Convention except *Balaena mysticetus*, *Enbalaena* spp., *Balaenoptera acutorostrata* (except population of West Greenland), *Balaenoptera bonaerensis*, *Balaenoptera borealis*, *Balaenoptera edeni*, *Balaenoptera musculus*, *Balaenoptera omurai*, *Balaenoptera physalus*, *Megaptera novaeangliae*, *Orcaella brevirostris*, *Orcaella heinsohni*, *Sotalia* spp., *Sousa* spp., *Eschrichtius robustus*, *Lipotes vexillifer*, *Caperea marginata*, *Neophocaena asiaeorientalis*, *Neophocaena phocaenoides*, *Phocoena sinus*, *Physeter macrocephalus*, *Platanista* spp., *Berardius* spp., *Hyperoodon* spp., which are listed in Appendix I. Specimens of the species listed in Appendix II to the Convention, including products and derivatives other than meat products for commercial purposes, taken by the people of Greenland under licence granted by the competent authority concerned, shall be treated as belonging to Annex B. A zero annual export quota is established for live specimens from the Black Sea population of *Tursiops truncatus* removed from the wild and traded for primarily commercial purposes.

(3) Populations of Botswana, Namibia, South Africa and Zimbabwe (listed in Annex B):

For the exclusive purpose of allowing: (a) trade in hunting trophies for non-commercial purposes; (b) trade in live animals to appropriate and acceptable destinations as defined in Resolution Conf. 11.20 (Rev. CoP18) for Botswana and Zimbabwe and for *in situ* conservation programmes for Namibia and South Africa; (c) trade in hides; (d) trade in hair; (e) trade in leather goods for commercial or non-commercial purposes for Botswana, Namibia and South Africa and for non-commercial purposes for Zimbabwe; (f) trade in individually marked and certified Ekipas incorporated in finished jewellery for non-commercial purposes for Namibia and ivory carvings for non-commercial purposes for Zimbabwe; (g) trade in registered raw ivory (for Botswana, Namibia, South Africa and Zimbabwe whole tusks and pieces) subject to the following: (i) only registered government-owned stocks, originating in the State (excluding seized ivory and ivory of unknown origin); (ii) only to trading partners that have been verified by the Secretariat, in consultation with the Standing Committee, to have sufficient national legislation and domestic trade controls to ensure that the imported ivory will not be re-exported and will be managed in accordance with all requirements of Resolution Conf. 10.10 (Rev. CoP18) concerning domestic manufacturing and trade; (iii) not before the Secretariat has verified the prospective importing countries and the registered government-owned stocks; (iv) raw ivory pursuant to the conditional sale of registered government-owned ivory stocks agreed at CoP12 which are 20,000 kg (Botswana), 10,000 kg (Namibia) and 30,000 kg (South Africa); (v) in addition to the quantities agreed at CoP12, government-owned ivory from Botswana, Namibia, South Africa and Zimbabwe registered by 31 January 2007 and verified by the Secretariat may be traded and despatched, with the ivory in paragraph (g)(iv) above in a single sale per destination under strict supervision of the Secretariat; (vi) the proceeds of the trade are used exclusively for elephant conservation and community conservation and development programmes within or adjacent to the elephant range; and (vii) the additional quantities specified in paragraph (g)(v) above shall be traded only after the Standing Committee has agreed that the above conditions have been met; (h) no further proposals to allow trade in elephant ivory from populations already in Annex B shall be submitted to the Conference of the Parties for the period from CoP14 and ending nine years from the date of the single sale of ivory that is to take place in accordance with provisions in paragraphs (g)(i), (g)(ii), (g)(iii), (g)(vi), and (g)(vii). In addition, such further proposals shall be dealt with in accordance with Decisions 14.77 and 14.78 (Rev. CoP15). On a proposal from the Secretariat, the Standing Committee can decide to cause this trade to cease partially or completely in the event of non-compliance by exporting or importing countries, or in the case of proven detrimental impacts of the trade on other elephant populations. All other specimens shall be deemed to be specimens of species included in Annex A and the trade in them shall be regulated accordingly.

(4) The following are not subject to the provisions of this Regulation:

Fossils;

Coral sand, that is to say, material consisting entirely or in part of finely crushed fragments of dead coral no larger than 2 mm in diameter, not identifiable to the level of genus, and which may also contain, amongst other things, the remains of Foraminifera, mollusc and crustacean shell, and coralline algae;

Coral fragments (including gravel and rubble), that is to say, unconsolidated fragments of broken finger-like dead coral and other material between 2 and 30 mm measured in any direction, not identifiable to the level of genus.

(5) Trade of specimens with source code A is allowed only if specimens traded possess cataphylls.

(6) Artificially propagated specimens of the following hybrids and/or cultivars are not subject to the provisions of this Regulation:

Hatiora x *graeseri Schlumbergera*

x *buckleyi*

Schlumbergera russelliana x *Schlumbergera truncata Schlumbergera*

orssichiana x *Schlumbergera truncata Schlumbergera opuntioides* x

Schlumbergera truncata Schlumbergera truncata (cultivars)

Cactaceae spp. colour mutants grafted on the following grafting stocks: *Harrisia* 'Jusbertii', *Hylocereus trigonus* or *Hylocereus undatus Opuntia microdasys* (cultivars)

(7) Artificially propagated hybrids of *Cymbidium*, *Dendrobium*, *Phalaenopsis* and *Vanda* are not subject to the provisions of this Regulation, when specimens are readily recognizable as artificially propagated and do not show any signs of having been collected in the wild such as mechanical damage or strong dehydration resulting from collection, irregular growth and heterogeneous size and shape within a taxon and shipment, algae or other epiphyllous organisms adhering to leaves, or damage by insects or other pests; and

(a) when shipped in non flowering state, the specimens must be traded in shipments consisting of individual containers (such as cartons, boxes, crates or individual shelves of CC-containers) each containing 20 or more plants of the same hybrid; the plants within each container must exhibit a high degree of uniformity and healthiness; and the shipment must be accompanied by documentation, such as an invoice, which clearly states the number of plants of each hybrid; or

(b) when shipped in flowering state, with at least one fully open flower per specimen, no minimum number of specimens per shipment is required but specimens must be professionally processed for commercial retail sale, e.g. labelled with printed labels or packaged with printed packages indicating the name of the hybrid and the country of final processing. This should be clearly visible and allow easy verification. Plants not clearly qualifying for the

exemption must be accompanied by appropriate CITES documents.

(8) Commission Regulation (EC) No 865/2006 of 4 May 2006 laying down detailed rules concerning the implementation of Council Regulation (EC) No 338/97 on the protection of species of wild fauna and flora by regulating trade therein (OJ L 166, 19.6.2006, p. 1).

(9) Artificially propagated specimens of cultivars of *Cyclamen persicum* are not subject to the provisions of this Regulation. However, the exemption does not apply to such specimens traded as dormant tubers.

(10) Artificially propagated hybrids and cultivars of *Taxus cuspidata*, live, in pots or other small containers, each consignment being accompanied by a label or document stating the name of the taxon or taxa and the text 'artificially propagated', are not subject to the provisions of this Regulation.
